Newspaper Sit-Upon

What is a Sit-Upon? Sit-Upons are a long-time Girl Scout tradition. It is something you sit-upon to keep dry and warm. Sit-upons are usually home-made, and are a great craft to make in preparation for a hike or camping trip.

Materials:

- 8-14 full-sized pages of newspaper or large newsprint sheets
- Glue
- Waterproof material (optional) i.e packing tape, shower curtain, vinyl tablecloth, or heavy duty trashbag

Vertical Strips 1 2 3 4 Horizontal Strips 16 5 6 6 7 7 13 8

Directions:

- 1. Fold paper in half.
- 2. Fold accordion style, in 2-3" wide folds.
- 3. Make 8-14 strips total (depending on the width of the strips and how big you want your mat).
- 4. Weave strips together tightly so it looks like the chart.
- 5. Fold under the loose ends and glue down, then let dry.
- 6. Cover in a waterproof material for extra durability (optional).

How to weave:

- For 8 strips there will be 16 ends, for 14 strips there will be 28 ends.
- Using 8 strips as an example, follow the directions below with the chart as reference.
- 1. Lay 4 strips vertically, right next to each other.
- 2. Lay 4 strips horizontally on top of the vertical strips.
- 3. Take the bottom of one of the vertical strips, and weave it up and over the top of 16.
- 4. Then weave it below 15, then over 14, and then underneath 13.
- 5. Repeat the process with the remaining vertical strips, keeping the weave tight.
- 6. Starting with the center strips and working outward will make it easier to keep it tight.
