Syracuse, N.Y. (May 30, 2024) — Five Girl Scouts of NYPENN Pathways (GSNYPENN) Council members earned the President's Volunteer Service Award for service to their communities in 2023, giving 534 collective hours of service. As a certifying organization, GSNYPENN identifies eligible members as potential recipients, verifies their service hours and distributes the awards.

Volunteer service included presenting activities at the Rosamond Gifford Zoo, hosting a tea party for local Girl Scouts, running a maker space at a local school, delivering supplies to area food banks and chaperoning a trip to New York City for older Girl Scouts to attend a United Nations tour to learn about U.N. careers.
