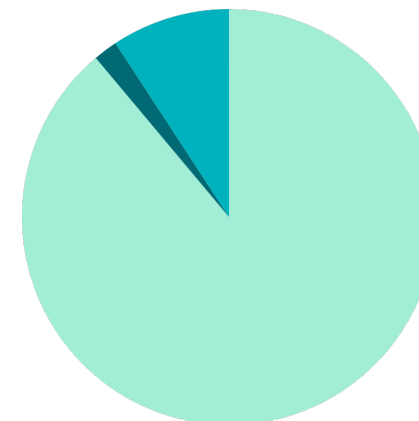

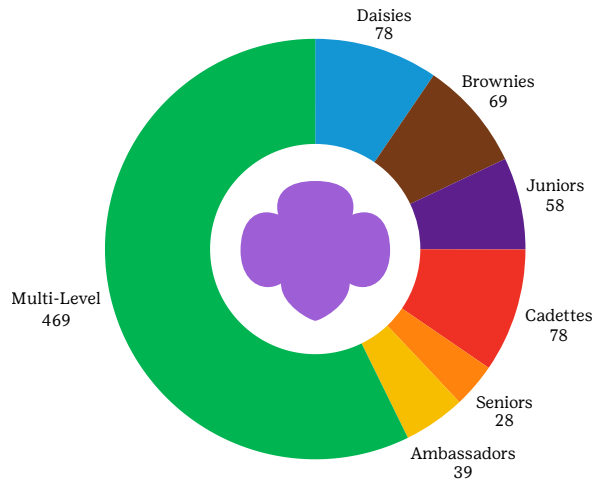

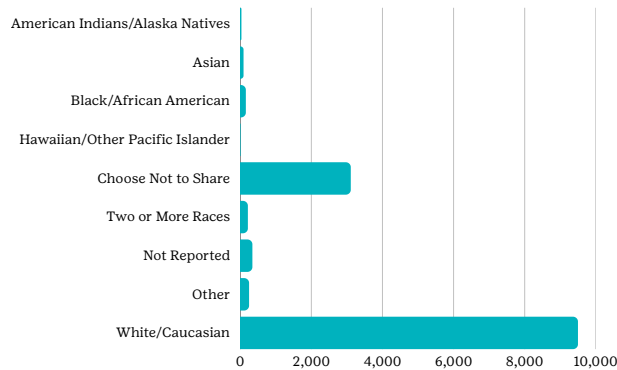

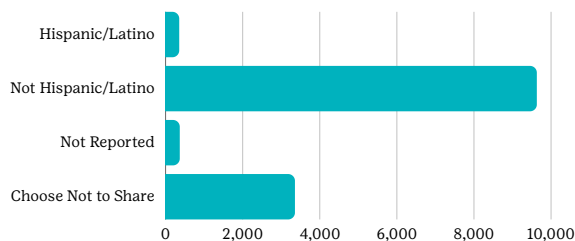
## Troops By Level

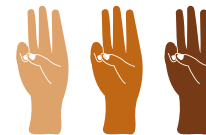

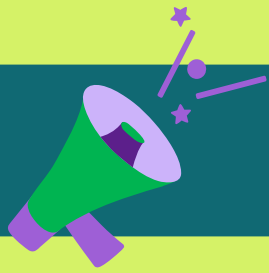

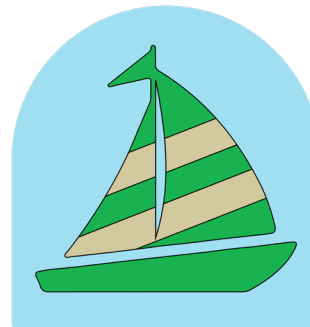

## Beyond Funders

**Thank you to those who supported Beyond programming during MY25: Excellus BlueCross BlueShield, Central New York Community Foundation, National Grid, Sweet on Chocolate, United Way of Broome County, Wiley Rein LLP, Individual Donors**

With 47% of our campers subsidized by financial assistance, the support we receive is crucial to keep Beyond programming accessible to all.

In 2025, Beyond secured \$30,000 in grant funding, including \$5,000 from Excellus BlueCross BlueShield and \$25,000 to expand monthly meetups for LGBTQ+ youth ages 12-17 into Broome County while increasing scholarship support for Camp Beyond Binary. This expansion aims to reduce chronic school absenteeism among LGBTQ+ youth.

We also strengthened community connections through new initiatives, including our first Sponsorship Reception Breakfast and Changemaker Awards, and partnerships that brought an LGBTQ+ Pride Prom to life at the Rosamond Gifford Zoo.

Beyond launched its first end-of-year giving campaign, raising \$6,100 from individual donors with a corporate match from Wiley Rein LLP.

We sustained program growth for a second consecutive year, offering all-family camp experiences, a well-attended Winter Break camp and new seasonal events including our first Halloween program.

Our annual lock-in returned for the first time since 2020, welcoming 270 youth and 115 adults to Mohawk Valley Community College in Utica. 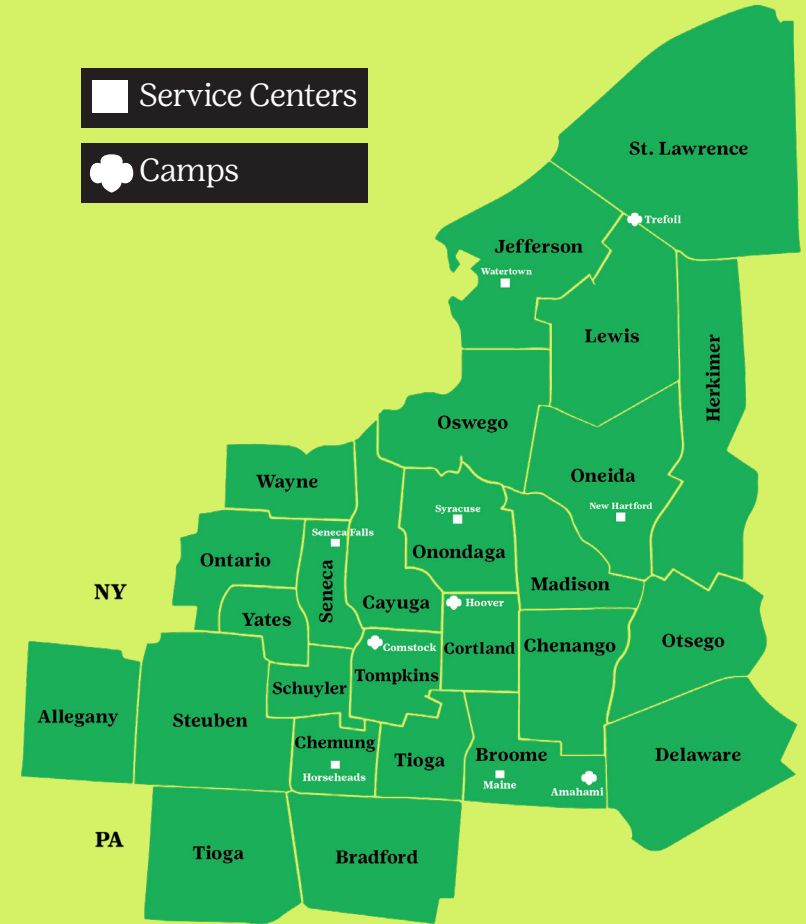
