CUSTOMER ENGAGEMENT

When a new member joins a troop, troop co-leaders will receive an email with the family's contact information. If a family reaches out to our Customer Engagement team at the council for help finding a troop, our team will also send you a text message.

Girl Roster Check

Are all your returning girls renewed? Is the "not returning button" checked in your myGS account for the girls not continuing? Do you have any new girls joining?

Adult Roster Check

Are all your returning adults renewed? Are they listed in "new" or "continued" volunteer roles? Does anyone need a new background check?

Troop Update

Have you filled out the "Update My Troop" form to give us your meeting details and maximum # of girls for your troop?

GOVERNANCE

Make your voice heard! Service Unit (SU) and National Council Session (NCS) Delegates are a critical part of representing the interests and diversity of our council at local and national levels.

SU Delegate Selections: October 1 to December 31, 2025

Delegates represent their respective SUs at our council's Annual Meeting each May to elect our Board Members and NCS Delegates, vote on changes to our organizational bylaws and provide feedback on policies and topics most affecting our members.

Every SU is entitled to select a Delegate and an Alternate between October 1 and December 31. Additional Delegate seats are allocated based on the number of SU members. Delegates must be registered council members and over the age of 14 by January 1, 2026. Delegates serve a one-year term for the 2026 calendar year and participate in virtual trainings and engagement sessions. Reach out to your SU Manager to learn more!

58th National Council Session & Girl Scout Convention in Washington, D.C. in 2026

At our 2025 Annual Meeting, our SU Delegates and Board Members elected seven NCS Delegates and three Alternates to represent our council at our Movement's 58th NCS. At this special gathering, which happens once every three years, Delegates from around the country and overseas vote on and discuss issues important to Girl Scouting and elect GSUSA leaders for the next triennium. HIGHEST AWARDS

Gold Award



25 GSNYPENN Girl Scouts earned their Gold Award in MY24!

The Gold Award is the highest a Senior or Ambassador (grades 9-12) can earn. Girl Scouts pursuing the Gold Award work at least 80 hours on a well-researched Take Action project that demonstrates their empathy, problem-solving and organizational skills, while leading a volunteer team to address the root cause of a community issue that will have an ongoing impact even after they have completed the project. The Gold Award is an individual project.

Benefits of becoming a Gold Award Girl Scout:

Grow Professional Skills

Gold Award Girl Scouts become pros in team building, problem solving, project planning and time management. These are invaluable skills all professionals need—and all people value. You can highlight these experiences as you apply to schools, jobs, internships and other opportunities.

Earn Scholarships

Many universities and colleges award scholarships to Gold Award Girl Scouts. GSNYPENN awards several yearly scholarships during our annual celebration event. Past scholarship amounts have ranged between \$250-5,000 per Girl Scout. GSUSA has committed to awarding one National Gold Award Scholarship annually per council for \$5,000 each.

Build Your Network

Gold Award Girl Scouts recruit and lead teams to do amazing things. This experience gives you a network of supporters that lasts a lifetime.

66 GSNYPEN Girl Scouts earned their Silver Award in MY24!

The Silver Award is the highest award a Cadette (grades 6-8) can earn. Cadettes work at least 50 hours each on a sustainable Take Action project that addresses an issue's root cause while gaining skills and confidence they will carry with them into adulthood. The Silver Award project can be worked on by a group of up to four Cadettes or one solo Cadette. It's recommended that Cadettes begin the Silver Award in 7th grade.

179 GSNYPENN Girl Scouts earned their Bronze Award in MY24!

The Bronze Award is the highest award a Junior (grades 4-5) can earn. After researching issues in their community that they are passionate about, a group of Juniors selects a project and works at least 20 hours each to make a difference in their community with a unique Take Action project.



Highest Awards Prerequisite Training

All highest awards require training that must be completed via gsLearn before beginning any work on the project. It's now easier than ever to earn our highest awards after changes made this summer by GSUSA. 


